I. <u>ONE THING</u>—The One Thing that I'd like to take away from today's class and believe God to accomplish in my life is:

II. APPLICATION AIDS

 - Meditate on the verses below, allowing the Holy Spirit to apply them to your heart and specific circumstances.
 - Pray, asking God to make these Scriptures your experience in this season of seeking to know Him better.
 - > Write down the personal applications you make and any evidence of God working them out in your life this week:
 - 1. Counting On God: He is going to finish what He's started in my life and the lives of those I love: Phil 1:6 AMP -- I am convinced and sure of this very thing, that He Who began a good work in you will continue until the day of Jesus Christ [right up to the time of His return], developing [that good work] and perfecting and bringing it to full completion in you.

2. <u>Confidence</u>: My God is Faithful and True, always working to fulfill His good and perfect will in my life: <u>Ps 107:1-2 NIV</u> -- Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever. Let the redeemed of the Lord say this—those He redeemed from the hand of the foe.

3. Completion: In my journey to know God, harvest is certain. As I pray and wait on God in faith, there is, and there will be, reason to rejoice: Ps 126 -- When the LORD brought back the captivity of Zion, we were like those who dream. Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with singing. Then they said among the nations, "The LORD has done great things for them."

The LORD has done great things for us, and we are glad. Bring back our captivity, O LORD, as the streams in the South. Those who sow in tears shall reap in joy. He who continually goes forth weeping, bearing seed for sowing, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him.
